

LLUÍS BORRASSÀ. THE REDISCOVERED COLOURS OF THE BARCELONA CATHEDRAL

This exhibition brings together, for the first time, 600 years after its creation, a large proportion of the paintings that Lluís Borrassà (Girona, circa 1360 - Barcelona, 1424-25) made for the Cathedral of Barcelona.

The genesis of the exhibition began with the purchase by the Generalitat of two panels by Borrassà, at the request of the Museum, from the cathedral, located in the art market. They are two magnificent paintings that are now presented together with other paintings by the same artist with the same origin, which were distributed among private collections and in other museums, such as the Museo Nacional del Prado and the Museu Episcopal de Vic.

The exhibition includes important original documents from the period, as well as a selection of drawings of the panels, made in the 19th century by historian Josep Puiggarí, the first scholar to rescue the painter's work from oblivion. Borrassà is one of the leading Catalan Gothic artists, and head of the most productive and influential art studio of the early 15th century in Catalonia.

The intensity and brilliance of the colours are two characteristic features of Borrassà's work. Analyses of the cathedral choir pulpit carried out at the Museum have confirmed that the artist painted it in lapis lazuli blue, the most expensive and appreciated colour of the time.

Among the documents on display is the purchase agreement of Lluc, a slave of Tartar origin who worked as a painter in Borrassà's studio. In addition to collaborators and apprentices, some painters had artists working in their studios who were slaves.
