The conference begins at 9.00 am on Monday, 7 April at the Museu Nacional d'Art de Catalunya, and ends with a Conference dinner at 8.00 p.m. on Friday, 9 April at the Palau Requesens,

Meals and receptions

Teas, coffees and lunches will be provided on all three days of the Conference in addition to dinners of Tuesday 8 April and Wednesday 9 April. On Monday 7 April a drinks reception will be offered by the Museum. Delegates will be expected to find their own dinner on the Monday.

Registration (Monday 9.00-10.00am)

Registration will be in the main counter of the Museum, where you will be able to pick up a conference pack with the final programme and delegate list. The Museu Nacional d'Art de Catalunya doesn't open to the public on Mondays, but doors will be open for the conference delegates from 8:30 am. All delegates are advised to arrive reasonably promptly. Welcome session will start at 10.00 am. If you miss the first session you will still be able to pick up your conference pack at the Reception Desk during the refreshment breaks and over lunch.

Approach

After the evening reception on Monday 7 April, there will be free coaches to go from the Museum to Plaça Espanya, and after last session on Wednesday 9 April there will be free coaches to go from the Museum to Plaça Espanya and to Gallery Hotel.

Safety & Security

Even though Barcelona is a safe city, we suggest you take the common sense precautions while you are here as you would when visiting any major city:

- Always remove your Conference pass upon leaving the museum
- Do not display large amounts of cash
- Keep your personal belongings with you, both inside and outside the museum
- Be vigilant in crowds, restaurants and on public transportation; watch out for people creating distractions and diversions
- When walking around the city, Know how to get to your destination in advance so you appear confident in where you are going

In the event of an Incident

If you are involved in any incident in the city, you can call the emergency number, **112**, that can be dialled free of charge from any fixed or mobile telephone in order to reach emergency services (police, ambulance, fire and rescue)

Carry Identification

You will need your conference pass to access the museum. By showing it, you will have free access to the permanent collection and the temporary exhibitions, and you will have a 5% discount in the Museum shop.
