



GOOD AT CAPTURING MOMENTS





Maspons was mainly interested in people and portraying them in everyday life. His photographs from the 1950s were related to the realistic and humanistic photography seen in Europe and the US after World War II.

Good photos, like chickens, roam freely and need to be rounded up. They're like mushrooms; you have to know how to find them. Some people find many, whereas others find none.






Maspons was curious and restless. He took advantage of any opportunity to discover new ways to live that were much freer and more modern than those of Franco's Spain. In Paris, he encountered photographers from the Club des 30 x 40 and AFAL group. He met influential photographers of that era (Cartier-Bresson, Brassaï, Iziz, etc) and realised he could devote himself to photography on a professional basis.

Did you know...?

It is said that Maspons took Spain's first photograph of a girl wearing a bikini. This was during his time in Ibiza. Did you notice the contrast between the young foreigner woman in the bikini and the two soldiers in the background? This photograph is a good example of Maspons' skill in capturing the moment of change that was taking place in our country.

A PIONEER WHO REVOLUTIONISED PHOTOGRAPHY

Maspons liked to experiment with the camera and offer surprising perspectives. Were you aware of his ability to play with forms and framings? He photographed realities in an original and personal way that made them highly familiar to us.







The frames and titles he often gave his photographs marked his own and unmistakable style... They are the virtues of today's instagramers. ARTISTIC PHOTOGRAPHY VS USEFUL PHOTOGRAPHY

While most of the country's amateur photographers competed in artistic competitions, entering photos taken only for the pleasure of being seen in galleries and exhibitions, Maspons stood for professional, useful photography - that is to say, applied onto print media like illustrations. His criticism of photographers pursuing gallery-ism got him expelled from the Catalan Photographic Association.

Art is the main enemy of photography. When a photographer wants to make art, he takes the most annoying aspects from a painting, such as the idea of a single piece. I know of two great fashion photographers - a Frenchman and a Spaniard - who have died from «artitis».




Silver Dry Plate: a silver gelatine and bromide preparation that is highly sensitive to light, and is used to obtain positive and negative photographs.

Baryta paper: photographic paper used as a medium for black and white photographs.

Facsimile: a faithful reproduction of a document (photograph, draw, print, etc.).

Pin-up: "calendar girl" - photos of models reproduced on posters, in magazines, on calendars, etc.



A PHOTO IS WORTH MORE THAN A THOUSAND WORDS



In the 1950s, photography replaced drawings for illustrating book covers and inner pages. A good example is Maspons' collaboration with the Biblioteca Breve collection.

Maspons and his partner Ubiña were also instrumental in introducing a new artistic genre into our country: the photobook, in which text and photography have equal narrative value.



Have you seen the photographs for the novel Caminando por las Hurdes? Where other photographers highlighted the drama of living conditions, Maspons captured people's dignity and authenticity.

In my day, many photographers were not allowed to be film directors, so we had to specialise in photography and make a whole movie in a single shot.

Observe the pictures from La caza de la perdiz roja and Toreo de salón. Do you see that photos placed side by side build sequences? They look like a movie without movement.





MASPONS PORTRAYED A CHANGING BARCELONA



In the 1960s, Maspons and Ubiña documented the industrialisation of the city and the construction of large housing blocks in the suburbs. Maspons also illustrated some of the city's best-known guides, such as *Barcelona pam a pam* and *Això també és Barcelona*, in which he, together with Ubiña, portrayed the more unusual and popular side of the city: the entertainment venues, markets, festivities and small urban trades.

At the end of the 1950s, illustrated magazines like *Destino*, *Triunfo* and *Gaceta llustrada* became popular. Maspons published several photojournalism pieces covering important events of the time. These included the 1962 Vallès floods and the 1972 US presidential election campaign.

For me, reporting is the quintessence of photography, as it allows you to travel around the world and come into contact with different cultures, people and environments.



To make a good advert, it is essential that there is full agreement and collaboration between the advertiser, the photographer and the graphic designer.

Did you know...?

The photographs of Cuba in this exhibition have never been on public display until now. Maspons took them during the summer of 1967 to illustrate a book containing text by Agustín Goytisolo that was never published.



THE MORE POLEMIC MASPONS

MASPONS AND THE MODELS



Throughout his life, Maspons photographed many models as a way of selling products through advertising and fashion catalogues. His images would change over time: from sensual, modern women to depersonalised mannequins and simple objects of desire.



THE GAUCHE DIVINE PHOTOGRAPHER

Given the choice between experiencing a moment in time or taking a photo of it, Maspons always preferred experiencing the moment. He liked to meet people and keep up with the latest trends and international fashion. This is why he is connected to the cultural and social elite of the time. He was a member of the Gauche Divine and would photograph the group whenever they met for celebrations and events.



Maspons loved to provoke. But... How far?

Look at his pictures for the magazine *Interviú* and his use of women's bodies. They reflect the sexist mentality of the time. How would today's public react to these images?



Autarky: economic and political system adopted by a country, based on the principle of self-sufficiency and the absence of contact with the outside world.


Still photo: photographs of highlights taken during filming that are used to document or promote a film.

Mary Quant: British fashion designer considered the inventor of the miniskirt in the 1960s.

Interviú magazine published an advertisement in 1977 to find women who had become pregnant from being raped. Did you see the photographs from the groups of feminists protesting in front of Maspons' studio? They launched a campaign against rape and against aggression towards women in general.
